Nara City's Support For Those Who Isolate Themselves from Society

In recent years the number of people who stay at home all the time and do not relate to society has been increasing nationwide, and the length of withdrawal has become longer.

This is an issue to be dealt with by the whole society. We'll introduce our support measures for them.

What Is Social Withdrawal?

Not going to work or school, not having any contact with people outside family, and continuously staying at home longer than six months.

1. Withdrawal in the narrow definition

Not going out of his/her room or house. Or staying at home usually but leaving for nearby places, such as convenience stores.

2. Quasi withdrawal

Staying at home usually but leaving home only when doing things related to his/her hobby.

3. Withdrawal in the broad definition

1. and 2. combined

What Is Nara City Doing for Socially Withdrawn People?

At "Restart Nara", the Nara City Support Center for the Young, founded in 2018 we have been supporting young people who remain reclusive after graduating school. Our support includes job assistance, relearning, counseling, etc.

What Is the Community Doing for Them?

"Anata-no-Manma" (Being yourself) is a place for young people who are likely to become isolated from society. Various activities, such as table tennis or hiking, are held there in a relaxed atmosphere. They are conducted by "Heart Hearth", a volunteer organization, in cooperation with Nara City Social Welfare Council.

What Are Schools Doing for Them?

Night classes are offered for people who did not attend school for various reasons when they were young. Kasuga Junior High School in Nara City is one of them. So if you stayed away from school education because of withdrawal, this is a place for you to learn again.

Temporary Large Amounts of Garbage, Due to Moving House and So on, Are Not Collected by Nara City.

Please make a reservation in advance of bringing it in to the Kankyo-Seibi Kojo (Environment Sanitation Plant), or ask General Waste Collection and Transportation Permit Agents in Nara City to dispose of it (for a fee).

Unburnable Garbage

Unburnable garbage may be disposed of in one transparent/semi-transparent 45-liter or less plastic bag. Please put all the garbage in the bag and fasten the garbage bag tightly. Umbrellas (except parasols) are allowed to be partially out of the bag. Generally, garbage which doesn't fit in a 45-liter bag or weighs more than 5kgs will be considered bulky garbage.

Procedures for Motorbikes or Light Motor Vehicles

All Light Motor Vehicle Taxes will be imposed on those who own motorbikes, light automobiles, small-sized special vehicles, or two-wheeled light vehicles (motorcycles) as of April 1. When you move out, pass a vehicle on to other owners, dispose of it, or if it gets stolen, please go through the procedures for changing ownership or vehicle disposal.

Three Customs

- 1 Never smoke in bed.

Four Measures

- 1 Install residential smoke alarms to be alerted of fires.
- 2 Use fire proof products to avoid fires spreading to bedding, clothing and curtains.
- 3 Install fire extinguishers to put out fires before they spread.
- 4 Make a cooperative system in your neighborhood to protect the elderly and the disabled.
- Residential Smoke Alarms Should Be Replaced Every Ten years

They won't be able to detect fires due to the deterioration of parts and/or expired.

Vaccination Week is a period for raising awareness of vaccinations and vaccination rates. Vaccination is very important to raise the immune system for the growth of the children, and they can avoid illness or have lessened symptoms if they are vaccinated.

March is a good month for parents to check whether their children have missed a shot before entering kindergarten or school in April. Please go through their vaccination recordings of the

Mother's and Child's Health Handbook again.

Medical Checkup for Babies and Children

Things to Bring: The questionnaire which will be sent during the middle of March and the *Mother's and Child's Health Handbook*. People who moved to Nara City after March 1 and have not received the questionnaire by the checkup day can come to the place directly on the day without it. Japanese Encephalitis Vaccinations for Those Born in March 2017

Receive all three times (the first, the second, and the booster) of the first term vaccination. Confirm it on the Preliminary Examination Leaflet.

The Period of Vaccination: Between age 3 and one day before the 7 and a half-year birthday Vaccination Schedule

Initial Vaccinations: Two times with an interval of one to four weeks.

Booster Vaccination: Once, with an interval of one year after the completion of the initial vaccinations.

Things to Bring: The Preliminary Examination Leaflet, *Mother's and Child's Health Handbook* and the child's ID document, such as a Health Insurance Card, etc.

*Those not registered as residents of Nara City on the day of vaccination are not eligible.

*Fill in the Preliminary Examination Leaflet with an indelible black ball-point pen.

Application: Make an appointment at a registered clinic (see the city website).

Renewal of Qualification Certificates for Child (Infant) Medical Expenses

The certificates for children who will enter the first grade of elementary or junior high school as of April 1 will be renewed, and the current certificates will expire on March 31. * Those who are not in those age-groups can continue to use the current certificate.

New Certificates Are for Those: Born between April 2, 2013 and April 1, 2014

Born between April 2, 2007 and April 1, 2008

- * The new certificates will be sent out in late March. Please send back the application form for the renewal qualification certificate for the child medical expenses, which is enclosed with the certificate.
- * Those eligible who do not have a qualification certificate now are encouraged to apply immediately.

Eligibility for Child Medical Expenses Furtherance:

Nara City residents who are covered by health insurance and have not graduated from Junior high school yet (up to the first March 31 after reaching the age of 15). However, those mentioned below are not qualified: Those covered by the Medical Expenses Furtherance System for the Mentally and Physically Handicapped, those covered by the Medical Expenses Furtherance System for Hitori-oya (single-parent) families, and those receiving welfare.

Rabies Shots Should Be Given Once A Year to Every Dog Older than 91 Days.

Place, Dates & Times: Please refer to the Japanese edition of the Shimin-Dayori (Nara City Information) on page 28 for the sites, dates and times. (Written in Japanese only.) It will be held even in case

Registration: 3,000 yen (If your dog is not registered.)

- Things to Bring: Owners of registered dogs should bring the postcard sent about the rabies preventive injection (3-ticket type, the postcard will be sent around the middle of March). Those with unregistered dogs should bring a memo with your address, your name, and phone number, as well as the kind, name, gender, birth date and color of your dog.
 - * Some dogs may not be allowed to receive the shot due to their physical condition.
 - * Dogs, collared, must be brought by a person who is accustomed to handling them.
 - * In case your dog cannot receive the shot at the site and within the term scheduled by the City, please take it to an animal hospital between April and June of 2020.
 - * Dog registration is legally required for each dog once in its life. Unregistered dogs need to be registered. Dogs can also be registered at the City Public Health Center, Shutchosho, Administration Centers and Liaison Offices as well as each shot site.

* Please use public transportation, since some sites don't have a parking lot.

Increases in Female-Specific Cancer

Breast cancer and cervical cancer in particular have increased among women. One woman in of eleven gets breast cancer and women aged twenties to their early forties mainly get cervical cancer. As breast cancer and cervical cancer can be detected at their early stages, please make sure to have a medical check once every two years.

*Cancer examinations for this fiscal year finished at the end of February. They will start again from July in 2020.

Women should perform monthly self-examinations of breast cancer and check for endometrial cancer if they have dysfunctional uterine bleeding. Please consult a doctor for any problems.

Amount of Female Hormone Secretions Changes Depending on Age.

It is useful to recognize the influences of female hormones on our bodies and minds. Let's make time for self-care for women's health!
