## Preparing for Flood : Don't Assume You're "Absolutely Safe".

On September 25, 1953 (Showa 28), a major flood overturned the myth that "Nara City is resistant to disaster". A raging typhoon hit the Saho River, which was said to befine in any circumstances. There are records that the Saho and, Tsubai areas as well as others flooded above floor level, and Sanjo Street became like a river. There is sufficient risk that typhoons and guerrilla torrential rainstorms will cause flood damage in Nara City in the future.

## Notice about New Corona Virus Vaccinations

New Corona Virus Vaccination is expected to be highly effective in preventing COVID-19 infection and reducing the virus' severity and fatality. Vaccination tickets have already been sent to all citizens 12 years of age and older. The vaccination is not mandatory, but please consider getting it to protect you and the people around you. A person with obesity **whose BMI is over 30 is said to be at increased risk.** If you have not gotten the vaccination, please consider getting it.

## Q & A about COVID-19 Virus and Vaccination

## Q: How do I know if I am infected with COVID-19 virus?

A: Various symptoms have been reported from no sign of symptoms, to those similar to a common cold such as fever and cough, to severe ones such as pneumonia and breathing difficulties. In some cases, **after effects** such as loss of the sense of smell or a taste, fatigue, and memory disorders **may remain for a long time**. Even if your symptoms are classified as mild, you may have a high fever over 38 ° C or a cough that lasts for about two weeks.

#### Q: How effective is the vaccine?

A: The effectiveness of the vaccine has been affirmed in clinical studies around the world. Inoculation creates immunity, and it can reduce the probability of infection and development of COVID-19.

#### Q: I am afraid of the vaccine's side effects.

A: Pain in the injection area, tiredness, and so on are reported. Symptoms are more apt to appear in the young than the elderly, but most recover within two or three days. If a high fever develops, you can use non-prescription antifebrile medicine.

## Q: Is the vaccination effective on variations of the virus?

A: Small mutations do not reduce its effectiveness. When more and more people are infected, the virus will vary more, and the possibility of causing mutations is higher. Vaccinating many people is linked to a reduction in new virus variants. To confirm the effectiveness of each variant virus and to develop new vaccines corresponding to virus variants has been studied.

## How to Make a Reservation for COVID-19 Vaccinations

## 1. Individual vaccinations with family doctors

You can make a reservation if your family doctor vaccinates against COVID-19. Confirm whether or not you can make a reservation when you see the doctor next time.

#### The Garbage Separation Method Will Change in January:

#### Shoes and Bags Will Become Burnable Garbage.

Footwear and bags, currently separated as unburnable, will become burnable garbage in January.

- Large items that cannot be put into a 45-liter garbage bag will be bulky garbage, just as they are now.
- One or two garbage bags can be put out by one household on one collection day. You can put out two garbage bags, one containing only shoes and bags, and the other containing other burnable garbage. The weight of the garbage bags should not be so heavy so that they cannot be lifted with one hand.
- Please remove metal parts such as buckles as much as possible. Those parts should be disposed of separately as unburnable garbage.
- · Items made only of metal or plastic are unburnable garbage.

## **Tuberculosis Examinations for Citizens**

Elderly tuberculosis patients are increasing in recent years. Early detection can often prevent not only facing severe disease yourself, but also infecting others. ## Japanese Encephalitis Vaccinations to Start (For Those Born in October 2018)

We recommend that your child receives the first term vaccination (the first two times, and a one-time booster). Please confirm their vaccination status on the preliminary examination leaflet.

**Those Eligible:** Between age 3 to one day before the 7-1/2-year birthday.

Vaccination Method: The first vaccinations are 1 to 4 weeks apart, and an additional vaccination is given one year after the second.

Things to Bring: Pre-examination sheets (please fill in with an indelible black pen), *Mother's and Child's Health Handbook* and you child's ID document.

\* Those who are not registered as residents of Nara City are not eligible.

## Periodical Inoculation with 23-Valent Pneumococcal Polysaccharide Vaccine (PPSV23) for Adults

## (Limited to Only Those Who Have Not Been Vaccinated)

#### You should not miss this opportunity, as the people eligible to receive vaccinations are different every year. You can be vaccinated even before your birthday within the fiscal year.

\* Please note that those who are a suitable age and have already received PPSV23 must pay in full. (Subsidies are limited to those who have not received the vaccination.) If you do not know whether you have received it or not, please make sure to contact Kenko-Zoshin-Ka (Health Care Section, 3rd Floor of Hagukumi-Center) in advance.

**Eligible**: Those who are the suitable ages on the table above for the vaccinations in fiscal year 2021 and are registered as a citizen of Nara City on the days for the vaccinations.

Fee: Copayment of 3,000 yen

\* Welfare protection recipients need to contact Kenko-Zoshin-Ka in advance.

- **Others**: 1. Vaccinations will be given only to those who choose to receive them and take responsibility, as it is classified as a B-category disease.
  - 2. Those who are between 60 and 65 and have disabilities of the heart, kidney or respiratory organs or have extreme limitations in daily life due to HIV or hope to receive the vaccination in other cities

(in Nara Prefecture) must go through a procedure in advance at Kenko-Zoshin-Ka.

Applications: Make an appointment in advance at a registered clinic in Nara City (see Nara City Website) and receive the vaccination.

## Watch Out for Infectious Gastroenteritis (Norovirus, etc.)

Infectious gastroenteritis is prevalent from late October to May.

#### \* Characteristics of norovirus infection

The incubation period from infection to onset is 24-48 hours.

Main symptoms are vomiting, nausea, diarrhea, abdominal pain and fever.

#### \* Points of caution

#### Proper hands washing

Wash your hands in an appropriate way before cooking and meals and also after coming home, using the toilet, and after handling vomit and excrement.

#### Prevention of food poisoning

Bivalves such as oysters should be heated sufficiently (Heat for 90 seconds at a core temperature of 85-90 degrees). Disinfect cooking utensils that handled bivalves with boiling water or chlorine kitchen bleach.

#### Proper treatment of vomit and excrement

Wear rubber gloves, a mask, and an apron to clean the toilet. After soaking it with paper towels with 0.1 % chlorine bleach, wipe it again with water.

#### If you have symptoms, go to a medical institution.

Infants and the elderly need to be especially careful of dehydration due to diarrhea and suffocation due to vomiting.

Stomach Cancer Examination: X-Ray (Involving drinking barium on that day)

Lung Cancer Examination: Chest X-Ray (Includes tuberculosis examination)

- **Fee**: 1,500 yen (1,000 yen for stomach cancer examination only and 500 yen for lung cancer examination only). Based on a general check-up for lung cancer, an additional fee of 600 yen might be needed for sputum examination. (Postage might need to be paid).
- **Those Eligible**: 40 years old and over except for: pregnant women; those who had stomach, lung, or intestine surgery or are in treatment; those who have barium sensitivity or had aspiration (lung cancer examination is possible); and those who had an endoscopy for stomach cancer by Nara City in the previous fiscal year (lung cancer examination is possible)
- **Others**: For those who are breast feeding, please inform us of such when you apply. The examination interval is once a year. There might be cases where you may not be able to have the examination depending on your physical condition or medical consultation on that day.

## Let's Reduce Food Waste at Home

## October Is Food Loss and Waste Reduction Promption Month

Food waste is food that is discarded even though it is edible, such as leftovers. The amount of food waste generated from households nationwide is about 2.8 million tons in one year, which means that each household (family of four) throws away food equivalent to about 60,000 yen per year. This month's issue introduces ways to reduce food waste at home and food donations.

## Let's Start at Home

## When Shopping

-Check the food in the refrigerator before going shopping

-Use up ingredients by buying small amounts rather than bulk

-Practice Temaedori, picking food from the front instead of the back of

display shelves at supermarkets if you plan on eating them soon

## When Cooking

-Try eat-all recipes which use things like vegetable peels, which is also effective in reducing kitchen garbage -Cook just enough for you to eat completely to eliminate leftovers

## When Storing

-Store ingredients in an appropriate way, such as using the vegetable chamber of the refrigerator so that they keep well

-Organize ingredients in the refrigerator so that you know where they are


## When Eating Out

-Order just the amount you can eat, such as small portioned meals and small bowls of rice

-Ask if you can take your leftovers home if you cannot eat it all

## Topics: Know the Difference between *Shouhi-Kigen* (Expiration Date) and *Shoumi-Kigen* (Best Before Date)

The expiration date is indicated on relatively perishable foods such as box lunches. Do not eat foods that have expired, as their safety is not guaranteed. On the other hand, the best-before date is indicated on foods that last relatively longer, such as snacks and canned foods. Eat at your own discretion after the best-before date. Let's reduce food waste by understanding the difference in labeling.
