Booster (Third) Vaccinations against COVID-19 have started!

You should receive a vaccination if at all possible to prevent severe disease. Vaccine vouchers will be sent before the planned schedule to promote early vaccination. As the time when vaccination vouchers are mailed may change depending on when your second shot was, please confirm it by calling the COVID-19 Vaccination Call Center or checking the Nara City Website. People who get vaccination vouchers can make reservations.

O about Vaccination Certificates

① Please keep your vaccination certificate carefully

The vaccination certificate attached with the 3rd vaccination voucher is the final document of certification. If you lose it, an issuance application is needed and the procedure will take a certain period of time.

2 Expiration date of vaccine is postponed

The period of validity for vaccines manufactured by Pfizer or Takeda/Moderna has been extended to 9 months from 6 months. For example, if the seal on thee vaccination certificate reads `expiration date: January 31`, it means that the vaccination you received is effective until 'April 30`.

* This notice is posted in each vaccination venue (medical institution).

Information when you are diagnosed as a close contact

<Who is a close contact?>

Those living with positive persons, including family members

If you have been in contact with the positive person from 2 days before the onset of symptoms (2 days before the examination date in the case of asymptomatic cases) to the present, and if any of the following conditions are met, there is the possibility you are a close contact.

- 1. If you had a long -time contact with a positive person, such as in a car,
- 2. If you examined and took care of a positive person without appropriate infection protection such as mask,
- 3. If you came in contact with a positive person, for example, having conversations without masks for 15 minutes or more at a distance of about 1 meter or less,

Check! For positive people who are staying at home:

You can apply for "a support pack (food, etc.)" on the city website. Please go to the site and confirm the conditions for application.

<If you are diagnosed as a close contact, please stay home for 7 days from the day you last met the positive person>

(The observation period for your physical condition may change depending on the situation).

The City Public Health Center will only call "family members living with a positive person" close contacts.

If there is the possibility that you are a close contact, please stay home voluntarily, even without contact from the Public Health Center.

If onset of illness is seen while you are staying home, inform the medical center about it and visit the hospital.

The observation period may change if key workers are diagnosed as close contacts.

Bring them to Kakyo-Seibi Kojo (Environment Sanitation Plant) after making a reservation or ask an agent with a General Waste Collection and Transportation permit in Nara City to dispose of it. (You will be charged a fee.) **Unburnable Garbage**

All unburnable garbage is to be put in a 45 liter or less transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag. Umbrellas (except beach sunshades) can stick out of the bag. Oversized items or those weighing more than 5 kg are considered bulky garbage.

Method: The first vaccination are 1 to 4 weeks apart, and an additional vaccination is given one year after the second. **Things to bring**: Pre-examination sheets (please fill in with an indelible black pen),

* Those who are not registered as residents of Nara City are not eligible.

Renewal of Qualification Certificates for Child (Infant) Medical Expenses

The new certificates will be sent out in late March. Please destroy the current ones which expire March 31, 2022 to protect your personal information or use the enclosed return envelope to send it back to Kodomo-Ikusei-Ka (Child Care Section). Those eligible who do not have a qualification certificate now are encouraged to apply immediately.

New Certificates Are for Those:

Born between April 2, 2015 and April 1, 2016 (Those who will enter the first grade of elementary school as of April 1.) Born between April 2, 2009 and April 1, 2010 (Those who will enter the first year of junior high school as of April 1.) * Those who are not in those age-groups can continue to use the current certificate.

Eligibility For Child Medical Expenses Furtherance:

Nara City residents who are covered by health insurance and have not graduated from junior high school yet (up to the first March 31 (Tues.) after reaching the age of 15). However, those mentioned below are not qualified: Those covered by the Medical Expenses Furtherance System for the Mentally and Physically Handicapped, Those covered by the Medical Expenses Furtherance System for Hitori-oya (single-parent) families, and those receiving welfare benefits.

Notice about HPV (human papillomavirus) Vaccinations

Receive Vaccinations on a Regular Basis for Prevention of Cervical Cancer

The HPV vaccination campaign was suspended until recently. However, according to the latest knowledge there are no specific anxieties of HPV vaccination safety. Additionally, it has been determined that vaccination's

merits surpass side effects. Therefor we will resume the HPV vaccination drive.

Those eligible: Girls who are registered as Nara citizens on the day of vaccination, and are between the ages of the 6th grade of elementary school and the 1st grade of high school.

*From April 1 of the school year when they become 12 years old to March 31 of the school year when they become 16 years old.

-Notices will be sent to those between 1st and 3rd grades of junior high school in the 2021 school year. The rest of the eligible people will receive the notice in or after the next school year. Vaccination will be available even without the notice.

How you will be vaccinated: There are two kinds of vaccine. You will receive either of them three times.

Things to bring: Your ID, such as Mother's and Child's Health Book, Health Insurance Card, etc.

The questionnaire sheet is not included in the notification letter.

It is available at medical facilities.

Application for vaccinations: Please call a medical facility listed on the City's website.

Catch-up vaccination for those who have not been vaccinated:

If you did not have an opportunity to get vaccinated because the HPV vaccination drive was cancelled, you will be able to receive it for three years from 2022. Details will be announced as soon as they are confirmed.

Annual Women's Health Week: March 1 to 8

Increases in Female-Specific Cancers

Breast cancer is on the rise every year and affects one in nine women. Cervical cancer often affects women between their 20s and early 40s. These can be detected early by screening, so please be sure to have a medical check once every two years. (Cancer examinations for the fiscal year 2021 finished at the end of February. They will start again from July 1, 2022)

- Breast Cancer: Be aware of your breasts and do self-checks on a regular basis. If you notice anything unusual, consult your doctor immediately.
- **Cervical Cancer:** This type of cancer doesn't emerge abruptly, but develops gradually over several years from a pre-cancerous state called dysplasia. In dysplasia, there are no symptoms, discharge, bleeding, or pain.
- **Endometrial Cancer:** Check for abnormal bleeding. If there is anything of concern, please seek medical attention immediately.

Notice of 2022 Rabies Prevention Group Injections

Rabies Shots Should be Given Once a Year to Every Dog Older than 91 Days

The notification post card (three-ticket type) will be sent at around the end of March.

Fee: Rabies Group Injection; 3,400 yen

Registration: 3,000 yen (If your dog is not registered.)

Things to Bring: A notification post card, if your dog is registered. If your dog is not registered, a memo written with your address, name, phone number, dog type, name, gender, birth date and color of your dog.

*Some dogs may not be allowed to receive the shot due to their physical condition.

*Dogs must be collared and brought by a person who is accustomed to handling them.

*If your dog can not receive the shot at the site, please get it at an animal hospital.

*Please refrain from coming by car, since some sites don't have a parking lot.

*Dog registration is an important once-in-a-lifetime procedure for each dog as stipulated by the Rabies Prevention Law. Unregistered dogs need to be registered. Dogs can also be registered at the City Public Health Center, Shutcho-sho (Branch Office), Administration Centers and Liaison Offices as well as each shot site.

*Due to the spread of COVID-19, the program above may not be conducted. Please check the city website or call to Hoken-Eisei-Ka (Life Sanitation Section) before coming.
