

NARA 2021: Manifestos for a Nara like future

An aging population combined with the diminishing number of children is not only a national issue, but also a Nara City issue. Measures and policies for residents set out on NARA 2021 are proceeding.

- "More open communication and compact municipalities"
- "Anticipatory investment for future generations" to have better child-rearing and educational settings
- "Welfare with sensibilities" to work in close cooperation with medical, nursing care, and welfare services

"Urban development and growth strategies with cooperation between Nara Prefecture and the City"

We will try to automate operations! [From this year]

City Hall operations are on the way to efficiency with RPA.

RPA means Robotic Process Automation. Instead of people, computers will perform tasks on computers.

So it will be effective and reduce overtime work for staff, thus giving citizens better service.

It will become more convenient have certificates issued! [From March in 2019]

We are making arrangements for convenience stores to issue certificates.

My Number cards will allow people to get certificates without written application forms at any convenience store all over Japan.

Certificates possible: Copy of resident cards, family register, registered seal impressions, certificates of taxation or tax-free income

Reception time at stores: 6:30-23:00, except around New Year Day

If you have a My Number card, you don't have to go to City Hall or another office. You can get certificates at convenience stores all over Japan.

Strategies to eliminate waiting lists for nursery schools!

We are making efforts to have more nurseries and increase staff.

- 1. We opened a new licensed nursery school in the Fushimi area this May.
- 2. We will open new licensed nursery schools in the Tomio and Tomigaoka areas in Oct. of 2019
- 3. We will use subsidies for housing accommodations for nursery staff within this fiscal year.

More and Better Bambi Homes! [From this year]

Lunch services have been started during summer holidays.

In addition to extended service hours and educational programs, safe and secure lunches are supplied.

This saves working parents time that they can use to communicate with children.

Lower expenses for medical fees for babies and little children! [From Aug, 2019]

We are preparing to lower expenses at reception. (Benefit in kind system)

Payment for pre-school children will be 500 JPY at medical reception for treatment, and 1000 JPY for hospitalization. 20% payment of total fee will not be necessary.

It will be possible to consult a doctor without temporary payment.

The security system for school children as they go to and return from is operating well! [Within this fiscal year]

All Nara City elementary schools will behave this system.

- 1. In addition to protection by school staff, guardians, and communities, communications equipment will be used to make children's activity more secure.
- 2. Besides this new communication service, model schools will pilot a program which will not only record when children enter and leave school but also track children's locations as they walk along the route.

You'll be able to check if children are safe even from remote places.

In Response to New Welfare Problems

We will work on advocacy for senior citizens' rights and lives.

The following have been carried out since April of this year;

1. Foundation of a center for supporting senior citizens' rights.

In order to protect the rights of those whose judgment is impaired due to dementia, mental disabilities, mental disorders, etc. we will provide professional support in identifying and resolving problems.

2. In order to solve troubles and problems in the region, we will promote a scheme of mutual support with a coordinator who takes the lead in daily-life support. We will support regional activities by offering information on wonderful support activities and saloon activities,

No-Kill Policy for Cats and Dogs

With cooperation from the Animal Welfare Association and pet shops, a No-Kill policy for will be implemented.

- 1. By promoting restriction on the breeding of stray cats, the number captured by the Health Center will be decreased (effective from April).
- 2. To promote appropriate breeding and handover of pets to new owners, an authorized standard was set. The "Cats and Dogs Partnership System" was founded to recognize pet shops that have attained this standard (effective from June)..

Repairing the Toilets of Schools Designated as Evacuation Shelters In particular, schools' gym toilets will be prioritized for repairs.

Multipurpose toilets will be set up in the gymnasiums of the elementary and junior high schools and senior high schools designated as evacuation facilities in disasters. They will be repaired so they can be used sanitarily and safely by anyone, including students. The toilets of 19 elementary schools, 12 junior high schools and 1 senior high school will be repaired. All of the toilets used for evacuation are to be completely repaired (**by the end of this year**)

To Enhance the Safety of the City

Learning from the earthquake in the north of Osaka, concrete-block walls of public facilities have been inspected.

At first, 2 block-walls in 2 nursery schools, 10 block-walls in 7 elementary schools, and 12 block-walls in 5 junior high schools will be repaired (**at the earliest convenience**).

Protect yourself from "Food Poisoning" !

This is Food Poisoning Season. August is Food Sanitation Month.

"Summer General Food Inspection" will be practiced up to the end of August.

Make Sure to Cook Meat Well-done

Food poisoning from campyrobacter or enterohemorrhagic coli (O157, O111, O26) is

caused by eating raw meat (such as yukhoe, sashimi) and underdone meat (such as tataki).

Instructions: 1) Be sure not to eat raw or insufficiently - heated meat.

- 2) Wash your hands carefully before cooking and eating.
- 3) Disinfect your cooking utensils such as knives and cutting board after washing.
- 4) Heat the inside of meat completely when you grill meat (yakiniku or barbecue) by yourself. Use different chopsticks for cooking and eating.
- 5) Heat the inside of meat completely, especially when you eat restructured meat, minced meat, striated meat, meat dipped in sauce, internal organs such as liver, etc.

Practice the Three Important Rules for Preventing Food Poisoning !

1) Don't get germs.

Wash your hands carefully with a medicated soap.

Keep cooking utensils clean.

2) Don't let germs multiply.

Cook smoothly and quickly, and don't leave food at room temperature for hours.

3) Sterilization.

Heat the inside of food at 75 degrees Celsius or over for more than one minute.

Renewals of (1) Child-Care Family Allowance (*Jido Fuyo Teate*) (2) Special Child-Care Allowance (*Tokubetsu Jido Fuyo Teate*)

The certificate of residence is not needed for the procedures.

The city government will send each allowance recipient a notice that describes the renewal process on July 31 (Mon.) for (1), and in early August for (2), so that the government can check if recipients are still qualified to receive allowances during this fiscal year. Be sure to complete your renewal process within the specified time period: August 1 (Wed.) – 31 (Fri.) for (1), and August 10 (Fri.) – September 11 (Tues.) for (2). Those who are no longer qualified to receive them should also go through the process. Recipients of (2) whose income exceeds the eligibility limits for two consecutive years do not have to go through the process. Those who have been qualified to receive (1) for five years and want to be exempted from the payment reduction starring from the 6th year should go through the necessary process during August, as notices have been sent. Japanese Encephalitis Vaccinations will start (For Those Born in August 2015)

Please receive the first term (the first, the second and the additional vaccination)!

(Please confirm your child's Preliminary Examination Leaflet.)

Period: from 3 years old to one day before turning seven and a half years old

How to receive: Normally the second vaccination is given from one to four weeks after the first one.

The additional vaccination is given one year after the second one.

bring the Mother's and Child's Health Handbook, Preliminary Examination Leaflet, and an

- (2) Those born between April 2, 2007 and April 1, 2009 who received the second term shots between ages 9 and 13, but haven't completed the first term shots are eligible to catch up on the missed shots.

* Another dose may be taken after 27 days for live vaccines, and after 6 days for inactivated vaccines. If you will get the same vaccines, make sure to keep to the prescribed intervals.

* Please check your child's *Mother's and Child's Health Handbook* and make an early appointment at a medical institution registered with the city (listed on the Nara City website) because of the limited period.

* The actual schedule is subject to change. Please ask your doctor or Hoken-Yobo-Ka to check it.
